It could be a funny reading pose or a photo of where you are most comfortable reading.</p>	<p>Design a new poster for book week using the theme "Old worlds, New worlds, Other worlds".</p>	<p>Design a book character costume. This could be made from things you already have at home or you can draw a picture and label the things you need to make it.</p>	<p>Decorate a cake or cupcakes to represent a book or book character.</p>
<p>Read a book with your pet or your favourite cuddly toy.</p>	<p>Design a book character artwork. Make a drawing, paint a picture, use craft materials or even make a model using playdoh!</p>	<p>Think of an old world, new world or other world and write a story in that world.</p>	<p>Design a new book cover for one of the shortlisted books or a book you have at home.</p>
<p>Create a diorama of part of a book you have read.</p>	<p>Create a book trailer for your favourite book or the last book you read.</p>	<p>Make a library or scene from a book in Minecraft and take a photo of it.</p>	<p>Design a book week themed face mask. It could be based on the theme or one of your favourite books.</p>
<p>Use Lego to build a library that your mini figs can visit. Remember libraries need spaces to read as well as books.</p>	<p>Write a description of a book you have read using 20 words or less.</p>	<p>Take a photo of your toys reading a book in different places around your house.</p>	<p>Spend time reading a book you love with someone that lives with you.</p>
<p>Rewrite the ending of your favourite book.</p> <p>You could add a new page to the end of a picture book or a new chapter for a novel.</p>	<p>Imagine you have discovered an animal in a New world or Other world and create an encyclopaedia entry for that animal. Include a picture of what it looks like as well as its name, diet, location/habitat, description and how it was discovered.</p>	<p>Write a book review of a book you have read during lockdown.</p> <p>If we have that book in the school library you can add your review to the library search engine.</p>	<p>Make a video or take a photo of your family or toys acting out a scene from a book.</p> <p>You could make it live action or create a stop motion by joining lots of photos together.</p>
